News from National

NTSB urges states to close licensure exemptions. During the National Transportation Safety Board investigation of the Merrimack Valley gas pipeline explosions, NSPE worked closely with NTSB staff. Consistent with long standing NSPE policy in opposition to engineering license exemptions, we strongly urged the NTSB to address such exemptions for the gas pipeline industry. We are gratified that NTSB heard our message and has recognized the importance of having a PE involved in key roles relevant to public safety within the gas pipeline industry. The NTSB final report includes strong language urging states that currently provide an engineering license exemption for gas pipeline operators to eliminate the exemption.

NTSB sent formal letters to the governors of the 31 states with license exemptions for gas pipeline operators, urging them to end those exemptions. The NTSB further asks the governors to provide an update to the NTSB within 90 days. NSPE has contacted the state societies in each of these states, asking them to make national aware of any developments in this area in their state and promising to continue to do likewise. We also reminded the states that we are available to support any state's efforts to eliminate licensing exemptions.

Commentary by the editor of the Philadelphia Engineer: Titusville Pennsylvania was the location of the first

oil well drilled in 1859. And so, while Pennsylvania was at the forefront of requiring engineers to be licensed, those in the oil and gas industry have been exempt from the requirement of overview of competence by a Board of Engineers as are others who are responsible for the health safety and welfare of the public. Other states may have other "sacred cows" such as New Jersey and the telecommunication industry.

But whether an industry may have deep pockets to compensate victims of negligence or even deliberate indifference to deaths and injuries is no excuse. Our legislators must be informed of the need for the self policing of engineering professionals by other engineers which is the basis of our registration laws.

High School Scholarships

The Philadelphia Chapter of PSPE (Pennsylvania Society of Professional Engineers) operates a scholarship program open to high school students who either (1) live in or (2) attend high school in the City of Philadelphia.
