After the start of a week of brutal weather, Mother Nature provided a beautiful night for over twenty engineers and others interested in ship building to tour the Philly Shipyard facility at The Navy Yard in Philadelphia. The presentation included a PowerPoint show introducing the company, the ship building process, the Jones Act that makes the shippard a viable shipbuilder in this country, and describing the types of vessels which have been built at the yard. The bulk of the night was spent walking through the various fabrication shops and around the two massive dry docks. All in attendance were amazed at the precision to which such large pieces can be joined and the massive equipment required to do so as well as the wide swath of engineering disciplines that were required to make this process a reality. The tour was approved for 2 Activity PDHs for New York and other states.

Coming up next week on February 2nd we have a special meeting to provide our Members with the opportunity to share their views on how our Society should consider various pending legislation impacting engineering and Engineers. This will be held at the Chart House Restaurant in a "round table" format to best facilitate sharing of opinions.
