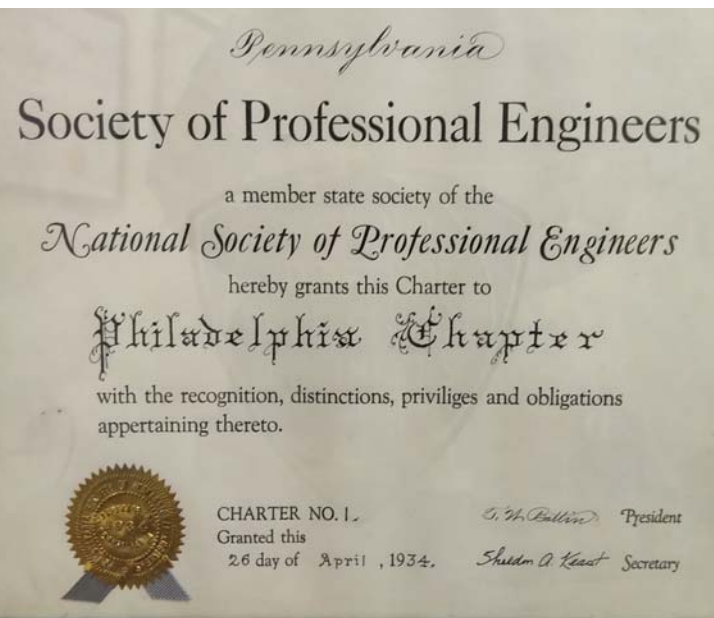

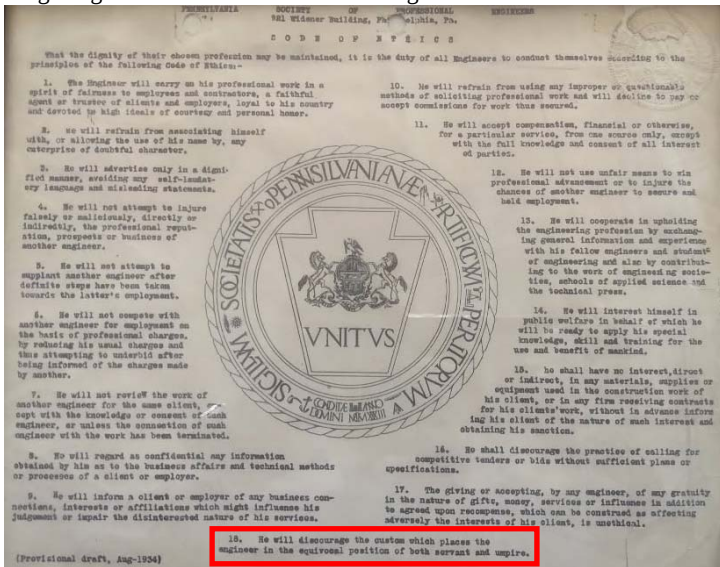

PSPE or NSPE_{PA}?

The structure of our organization is tripartite. Your One Membership Application and Billing Invoice actually covers three distinct Memberships. **At the County level**, we meet for meetings and tours, camaraderie and networking, and perhaps to further efforts of requirements to acquire the 24 PDH for license renewal, or better to acquire knowledge to assist our practice of engineering to best serve the public.

At the National level, NSPE is an organization of organizations. "The goals of the National Society of Professional Engineers focuses on growth in mission impact, increased public recognition, expanded membership participation, and financial sustainability. The overarching mission is to foster professional engineers in service to society."

At the Pennsylvania State level, our goals, aspirations and mission are quite different. This goes back to our founding in 1934, almost a century ago. Our motto is "to protect the public health, safety, **property** and welfare above all other considerations." The word "**property**" does not appear in the national nor most other state core values. Perhaps the reasoning to add "**property**" may come from our society Code of Ethics [Provisional draft, Aug 1934] item 18 of 18, "He shall discourage the custom which places the engineer in the equivocal position of both servant and umpire." As you know, there is no current restriction requiring calling for an independent engineer to supervise the contractor performing to the design engineer's instruction. But the thought was there in 1934.



If the professional engineer is required to consider/protect the property of the general public, and "public" includes the contractor, then the engineer (while having a contractual duty to employing owner of project) also has a fiduciary duty to that contractor to be fair and independent of that owner's desires while enforcing its specification. We in Pennsylvania are different!

In most of the USA, there exists a judicial decision which protects engineers from tort liability for errors of design. Not in Pennsylvania. The "Economic Loss Doctrine" was rejected by our Supreme Court in *Bilt-Rite Contractors v Architectural Studios* (581 Pa. 454 2005) such decision being later adopted in other states such as Florida. Our Chapter, jointly with the Montgomery Bar Association, has provided a [PDH lecture](#) on this topic.

Pennsylvania (and seven other states) require a criminal background check as part of application for registration and licensure. Most states do not, and their license only attests to technical competency, not principles nor morals.

Most states accept instruction towards building one's practice acceptable for continuing education. Pennsylvania mandates technical topics only.

Matters for Members of PSPE to discuss include issues well above technical competency. We need to educate the public and our legislators of the dangers of "the industrial exemption." To design a sewer connection from a private home to the public line requires a Professional Engineer's seal. Why does not a high pressure fracked gas line running via easements through a housing development or grade school parking lot? Do we need people to be killed ([as in Massachusetts](#)) to call to correct? These and many other issues are the realm of what we of PSPE need to discuss.
